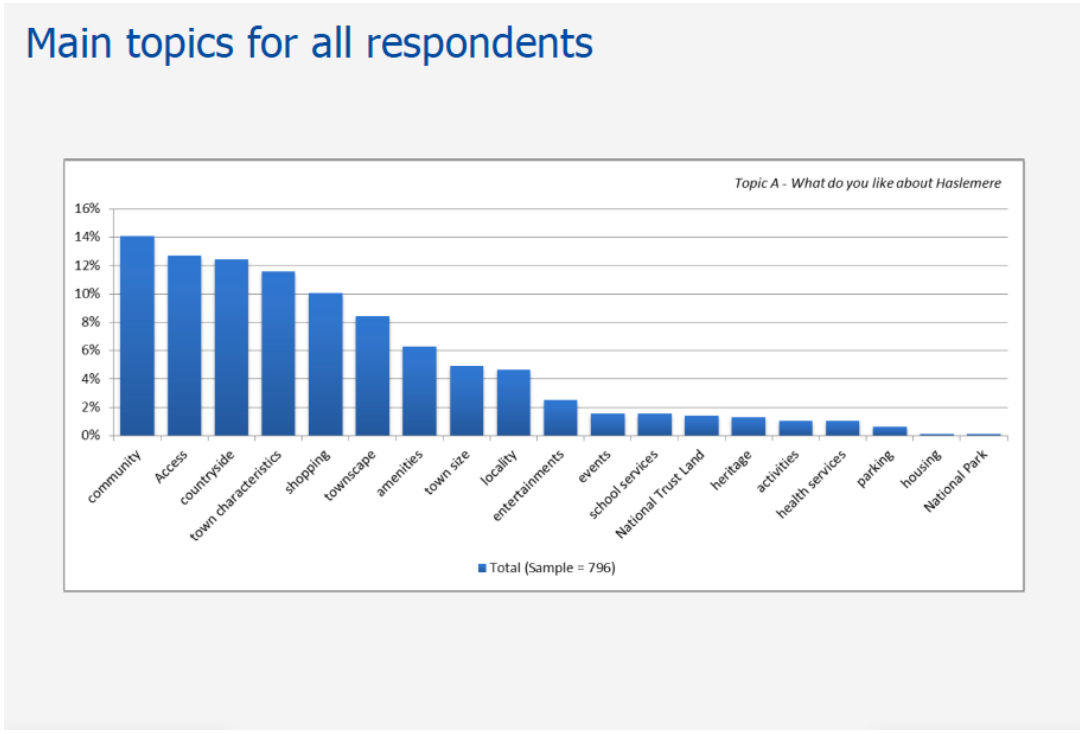
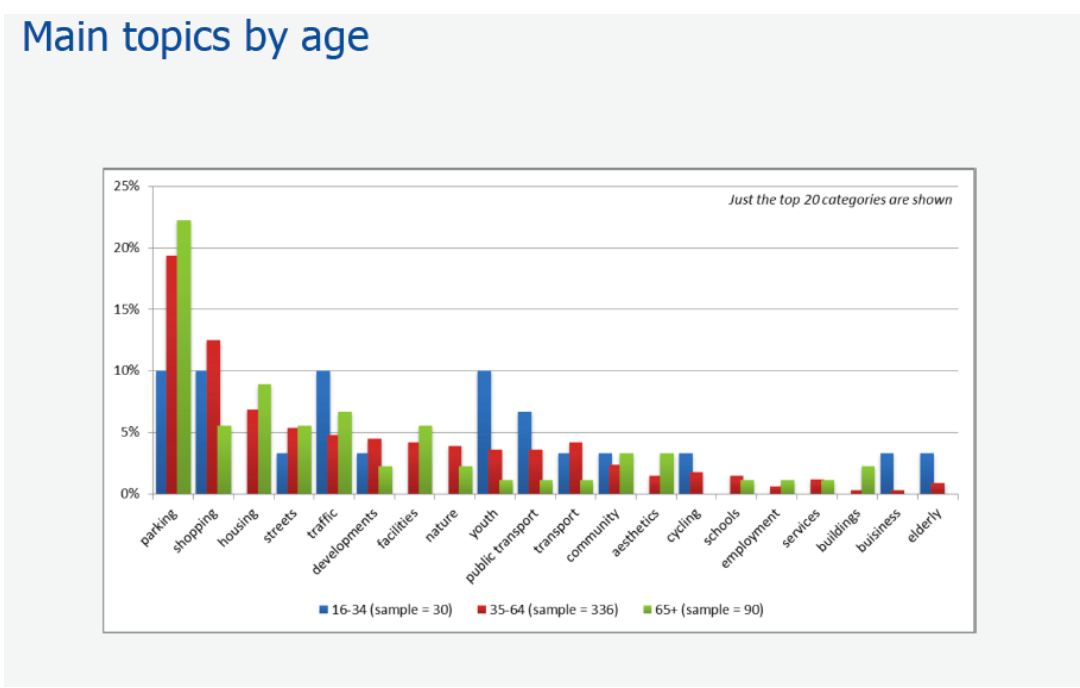

What are the issues you think could be addressed by a Neighbourhood Plan for Haslemere and surrounding villages:

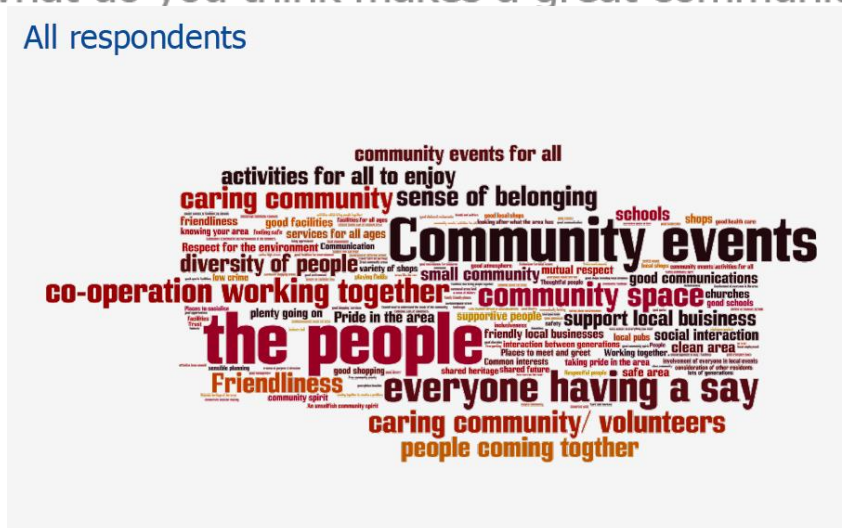

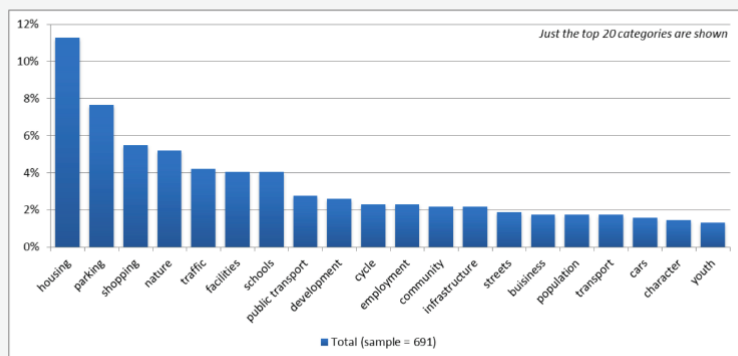

What do you think makes a great community?

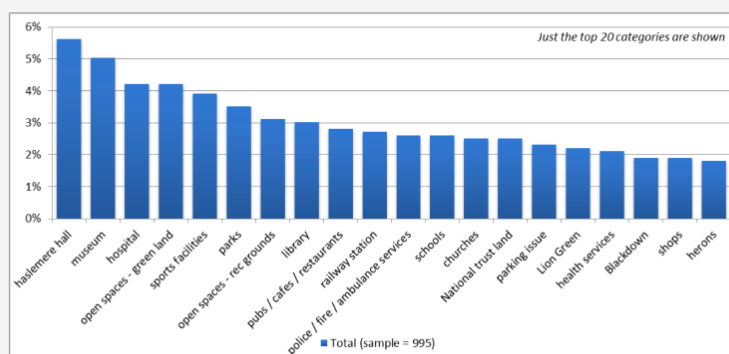
All respondents



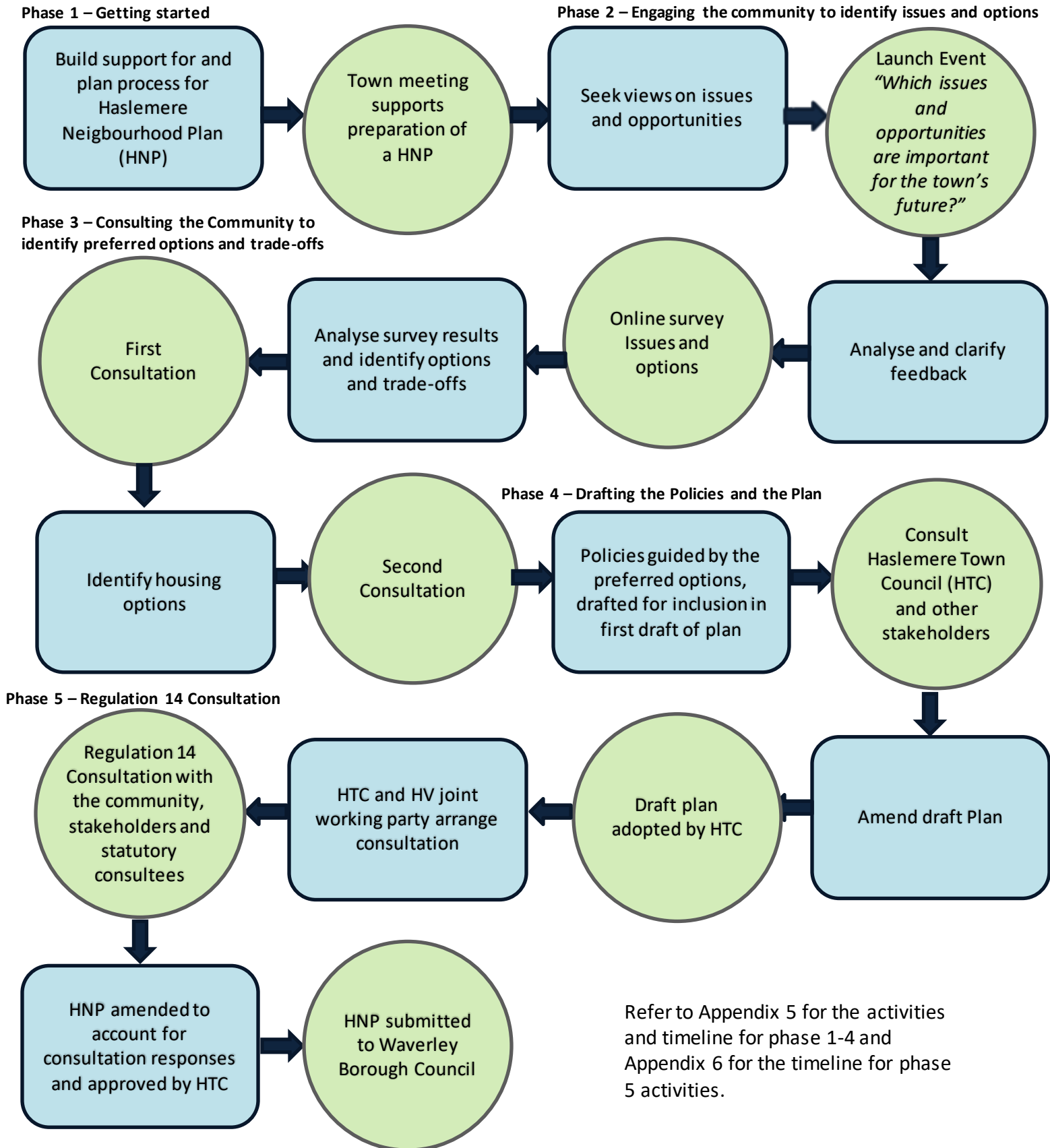
Changes to Haslemere in next 5-20 years: Main topics for all respondents

Appendix 5: Neighbourhood planning activities timeline

Date	Activity – Phase 1 Getting started
August 2012	A group of Haslemere residents propose a Neighbourhood Forum. HTC agree to support.
28th September 2012	Public Meeting held at Haslemere Museum attended by over 100 residents. Proposal to form a Neighbourhood Forum is supported.
October 2012	Volunteer Organising Group (OG) and Work Groups (WG) formed. OG seek advice from Locality and other NP groups on process and organisation.
November 2012	HTC apply to WBC to designate the town boundary as the Neighbourhood Area.
February 2013	Haslemere Vision Ltd, a community company limited by guarantee, formed.
March 2013	HV agree Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with HTC.
April 2013	Haslemere Vision launched at an all-day event in Haslemere Hall. Attended by 320 local residents. New volunteers recruited and support for organisation and process demonstrated by vote in favour.
22 February 2016	HV and HTC agree updated MOU.
Date	Activity – Phase 2 Engaging the Community to identify issues and opportunities
April 2013	At the HV launch event the Localism Act and the concepts of neighbourhood planning were explained to attendees who were invited to identify what they liked and disliked about Haslemere and indicate support for the formation of HV.
May 2013	HV takes a stand at Fringe Festival event on Lion green Asking same questions as those at the launch.
July 2013	Online questionnaire launched and widely advertised. Asks the same questions as at the launch event.
July 2013	Afternoon workshop with elderly residents at Redwood Manor asking same questions as launch/questionnaire.
August 2013	Volunteers invited to join the Steering Group. Five work groups formed including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Transport, Traffic and Parking – Business and Economy – Natural & Built Environment – Culture, Education & Leisure – Wellbeing, Health & Inclusion Organising Group is wound up to be replaced by the Steering Group.
September 2013	Steering Group and Work Groups convened and briefed. Workshops held: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – -Sept 14th Localism and neighbourhood planning – -Sept 28th Visioning.
September 2013	Online survey closes.
12th October 2013	Drop in afternoon at Beacon Hill School for Beacon Hill and Hindhead residents.

23rd September 2014	Results of Stage 1 Consultation presented at public meeting at Georgian House Hotel.
5th March 2015	Update to HTC Councillors.
August - October 2015	Series of 3 press releases on housing related topics. 4 articles run in Haslemere Herald (3/9/15, 11/9/15, 26/9/15, 28/10/15).
September -November 2015	Stage 2 Housing Consultation.
20th December 2015	Article in Haslemere Herald - Over 900 responses to consultation
January 2016	Results of Stage 2 Consultation presented at public meeting at the Georgian House Hotel.
January- February 2016	Station Transport survey.
April 2016	Beacon Hill and Hindhead Consultation.
December 2016	Meeting with other community organisations to discuss the community project opportunities identified by our consultations.

Date	Activity – Phase 4 Drafting the Policies and the Plan
7th March 2014	Five Policy Drafting Groups formed to review consultation feedback and commence drafting policies on: Housing, Economy, Community action*, Environment, Access (Transport). *The Community action Work Group was subsequently disbanded because it was concluded that “community action” was not, in itself, a planning policy issue.
20th Oct 2015	Policy Drafting Workshop.
June 2016	Comments on NP received from WBC Planning Officers.
September 2016	NP draft shared with HTC.
September 2016 – April 2017	Policy redrafting based on HTC comments.
15th June 2017	Meeting with WBC Planning Officers to discuss draft NP policies.
15th August 2017	WBC housing allocation increased. Haslemere target increased from 830 to 990 homes. LPP2 will be delayed as a result.
16th August 2017	Meeting with WBC Planning Officers to discuss NP and LPP2 timing.
August 2017	Policies reviewed by Tony Burton, independent planning consultant. (Initial health check).
September 2017 – March 2018	Policies redrafted based on the initial health check review.
11th November 2017	Meetings of policy drafting groups and project leadership team to refine policy wording.
March 2018	Meeting with WBC to discuss NP draft.
March – June 2018	NP redrafting continues.
July 2018	HTC NP Working party provides comments on the draft NP.
November 2018	Summary NP document drafted.
July – February 2019	NP redrafting continues and plan document layout and content improved and images added.
21st March 2019	Draft Neighbourhood Plan approved by Haslemere Town Council.
3rd June 2019 followed by regular monthly meetings	New NP Joint working party meet (HTC councillors and HV volunteers) to plan consultation.
26th June 2019	Request for Sustainability Screening Opinion submitted.
October 2019	NP Joint working party propose redrafting settlement boundary. Guidance sought from independent planning consultant.
28th November 2019	Amended Draft Neighbourhood Plan (settlement boundary altered slightly) adopted by Haslemere Town Council and put forward for public consultation.
10th January 2020 and weekly thereafter	NP Joint working party meet to plan and run Regulation 14 consultation.
